NYS DAR SCHOLARSHIP:

Criteria: This scholarship is to financially assist a deserving high school senior acquiring a higher education in a New York State 4-year college or university, maintaining at least a B average. Applicant must be in the top 25% of their class, be a NYS resident and a U.S. citizen.

Award: \$2,000 (\$500 each year for 4 years)

the Guidance Office by December 14, 2009.**

(NYS DAR) DAMARIS SMITH DESIMONE SCHOLARSHIP:

Criteria: This scholarship is to financially assist a deserving young people acquiring a higher education in United States History at a 4-year college or university. It is based on merit and achievement during high school, with a regard to community service, personal and academic interest. Applicants must residents of NYS.

Award: \$1,000

(NYS DAR) HELEN AND ARNOLD BARBEN SCHOLARSHIP FUND:

Criteria: This scholarship is to financially assist a deserving young WOMAN acquiring a higher education at a 4-year college or university. It is based on her merit and achievement in high school, community and with regard to her personal and academic interest. Applicants must be NYS residents and born in the USA. Winners must maintain a B average through college years.

Award: \$2,000 (\$500 each year for 4 years)

FRANCES CRAWFORD MARVIN AMERICAN INDIAN SCHOLARSHIP:

Criteria: This scholarship is awarded to Native Americans. This award is intended to help a full time enrolled Native American college student of any age, any tribe, in any state striving to obtain an education. A candidate for this scholarship is judged based on financial need, academic achievement, and a 3.0 GPA or higher.

Award: Varies each year depending on the total return of the endowment but is a substantial amount (several thousand dollars). The money is sent directly to the respective school.
